Dear Parent and Carers,

Well, we made it through our first 2 days of the national lockdown. All our new processes seem to be working, and everyone, as always has embraced the changes with positivity and determination to do what is right for our children.

The one thing that has not worked quite as well is the accelerated pick up time. Before reverting back to the original 10-minute slots, I would like to propose that those parents picking up from Panda class and Dolphins now exit back through the front gates. We will open up the large gates to help with distancing. Please do keep to your time slot and do not arrive early. We appear to have a surge of parents arriving early for the first pick up. This is causing a big problem outside the school. We cannot open the gates early so please do not arrive early. To help with this, I have tweaked collection to a 5-minute window like drop off time.
