

In the Early Years Foundation Stage, topics are used as hooks to engage children in a developmentally appropriate and challenging curriculum. There are carefully positioned topic hooks throughout that will be introduced throughout the year, but there is always flexibility with these to ensure they are planned based around the children's current interests and needs. The developmentally appropriate curriculum is progressively structured and sits underneath these flexible hooks. Linking with Key Stage One we launch new topic hooks with inquiry questions and get children to wonder and think big.
